MCBS is a congregation of Catholic fathers from Kerala, working for the welfare of humanity after the model of Jesus Christ. They are working in almost all continents of the world for the emancipation of the oppressed and the underprivileged in educational, social, medical and spiritual needs of human society. The school has got minority status. The school is affiliated to Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE), Delhi on 24th February 2021 with the No. 831125 and our School No. is 46758.

The school tries to bring out the best in every student through a sound academic, physical, intellectual, psychological, moral and social formation. The school is named after Saint Joseph, the father of Jesus who is a model of living for the staff and students, for he was a man of justice, firm faith and dedication. The school is open to all, irrespective of caste and creed. The school has a well-qualified faculty and well-advanced learning aids as well as infrastructure to give quality education to all students.

MOTTO "INFORMATION, FORMATION, TRANSFORMATION"

The motto of St. Joseph's Public School is "Information, Formation and Transformation" through Spiritual, Intellectual, Psycho cultural and Corporal growth programme.

The School aims at identifying and nurturing the innate potentials of every student through the curricular, co-curricular and

extracurricular activities. Through these activities the process of "Information" takes place. When this information is assimilated "Formation" happens. Various inborn and acquired talents of students are developed and moral behaviour is inculcated through the continuous process of caring in intellectual, spiritual, psycho cultural and corporal realms. This formation automatically leads to "Transformation". Students become means of social change transforming the society into a better place to live in. The students are thus motivated to aim at excellence not only in academic pursuit, but also in all aspects of human endeavour and adorn themselves with the hallmarks of a holistic personality. Every student is transformed into a courageous, disciplined, noble person to face the challenges of the world with deep trust in God, lighting the candle of hope for millions in the world at large. With this goal in mind St Joseph's Public School has taken as its motto "Information, Formation and Transformation."

VISION: To be an agent of Transformation in creating society built on justice, love and harmony.

MISSION: Emancipation of the oppressed and the underprivileged in educational, social, medical and spiritual needs of human society.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

The St Joseph's Public School community is committed in making our school a safe, caring and learning environment for all its students. Therefore, adherence to the school rules and regulations are obligatory as they reflect the community's expectations in terms of acceptable standards of behaviour, code of conduct, dress and personal presentation in the widest sense. They help the students as well as the co-operators to maintain the discipline essential to the

educational endeavour to inculcate values and to bring safety and security for them. All rights (according to the Government Educational policies) are reserved to the School disciplinary committee to take actions against any violation of this code of conduct.

A. ADMISSIONS AND WITHDRAWAL

- 1 ADMISSION to a class is restricted by certain Government regulations and by the conditions of age, ability and conduct.
- 2 The age for admission to Class I is above five year and ten months, with a corresponding increase for the higher classes.
- The Transfer Certificate of a pupil from a school outside Karnataka State must be countersigned by the Educational Inspector of the District in which the former school is situated.
- 4. No Transfer Certificate will be issued unless applied for in person by the parent or guardian or school in the prescribed form and after all the dues have been paid.
- Candidates coming for admission from unrecognized schools must pass a written test in such subjects as may be required of them.
- 6. Pupils who leave without notice and pupils whose names are struck off the rolls for unexplained absence of more than three months are as a rule, not readmitted. Readmission is granted only on the basis of certified proofs.
- 7. The birth certificate and Aadhar Card (original with a photocopy) and address proof issued by the competent Govt./
 Municipal authorities has to be produced at the time of admission.

B. RULES OF DISCIPLINE

- 1 Regular attendance and study habits, prompt obedience, courtesy in speech and conduct (to staff as well as fellow students), cleanliness of dress and person are expected from every student.
- 2. Unacceptable behaviour including but not limited to irregular attendance, habitual idleness, continuous negligence in studies, academic dishonesty, disobedience, objectionable moral influence, cheating, stealing etc. in and out of school justify serious disciplinary action including dismissal of a pupil.
- 3. No child is expected to receive anything from outsiders.
- 4. The medium of instruction in the school is English. For improving the proficiency in language and to maintain discipline, students ought to communicate in English at all time in the school premises.
- 5. Pupils are expected to come to school with all that is necessary for theirs day's work. Borrowing or lending of pencils, eraser, instrument box etc., are discouraged.
- 6. Personal cleanliness and hygiene are greatly expected from all.
- 7. The school uniform and identity card must be worn daily.
- 8. Finger nails must be cut short and kept clean.
- Girls should keep their hair neatly bobbed or plaited. Hair bands and ribbons must be used. Boys should keep their hair short and neat.
- 10. Shoes should be maintained neat and tidy with the laces properly tied. Socks should be washed and changed every day.

- 11. Students should keep the classrooms and premises clean and tide. They should use the baskets and bins provided for this purpose.
- 12. Pupils must take care of the equipment's that have been lent for their use. Students are to refrain from damaging any form of school property. The school reserves the right to be compensated by the students/class for any such damages.
- 13. No fund collection for any purpose will be made without the prior permission of the principal.
- 14. No pupil is exempted from games and physical training without a grave reason or the request from parents. The period of exemption should be mentioned.
- 15. No books (other than school books), newspapers or periodicals may be brought to the school without the class teacher's permission. Use of mobile is strictly prohibited in and around school premises.
- 16. For safety and security and to maintain the study ambience, students are expected to refrain from wearing any form of ornaments or make up like nail polish, mehandi design etc. while attending the school.
- 17. We have digitalized the classrooms to facilitate audio-visual learning and to make learning a pleasurable experience. Any damage to interactive boards, LCD projectors etc. in classrooms will be charged from the students of the concerned class.
- 18. Considering other student's health, students having infectious diseases are not to be brought to school for appearing in examinations or other activities.

19. Parents are expected to contact school and teachers only through school office phone. Direct contacts to teachers through mobile especially after school hours are highly discouraged.

C. LEAVE

- 1 No leave of absence is granted except on prior written application from parents or local guardian and only for grave reasons.
- During school hours no student is allowed to leave the classroom
 without the permission of the teacher or until the class is
 dispersed. Written permission of Principal or Academic Coordinators is required for the student to leave the school
 premises during the school hours. Breach of these rules will be
 viewed seriously.
- 3. It may be noted that children will not be sent home, even in an emergency, with anyone who might come for them during school hours without a written request from the parent or guardian.
- 4. Attendance on the first day of the school after every reopening and on special co-curricular days (Sports day, Arts day, Annual day etc.) is compulsory.
- 5. Pupil who has been absent from school or late will not be admitted to the class without the Principal's or teacher-in-charge's permission.
- 6. A child coming to school after an infectious disease must bring a doctor's certificate permitting him to join the class.
- 7. If a pupil is ill for more than three days, the parents or guardians must inform the school authorities and a medical certificate

- must be produced stating the period for which the child is likely to remain absent.
- 8. No re-examinations will be conducted for absentees without grave reasons.

D. BUS RULES

- 1 The bus will run only to the stops of each locality and not to the individual houses.
- 2. Students who are not in time for the bus will have to make their own arrangement on that day to come to school.
- 3. Proper discipline, obedience and decent behaviour are expected from every student travelling in the bus. They are to communicate in English among themselves.
- 4. Bus fees have to be paid in time. Students who are not regular in payment and those who make any damage will not be allowed to board the bus.
- 5. The bus service must be hired for the whole year.
- 6. School will not be responsible for the travel facility and safety of children who uses private vehicle for transportation.

E. RECOMMENDATIONS TO PARENTS

- 1. Parents are expected to be co-operative with the school authorities in enforcing regularity and discipline. They ought to see that the children leave their homes in time to be punctual in school, they do the work assigned to them at home and are provided with the necessary books and stationary.
- 2. Parents are requested to go through the reports and recommendations by teachers made in the school handbook

- and in school mobile application. They are to acknowledge them as a proof that they have read them.
- 3. Parents or guardians or other persons are not allowed to meet the children or teachers during the working hours without the permission of the Principal. Members of the staff can be met only during their free periods by prior appointment or during the recess.
- 4. No outsiders are permitted in the school compound except parents, local guardian, brothers and sisters.
- 5. In case of enquiry or complaint, parents themselves should come and meet or mail to the school or Principal. The Principal and teachers will deal only with parents or the local guardian, and not any other relatives or employees.
- 6. Any communication (request or complaint) made by the parents should be addressed to the Principal and not to the class teacher. All correspondence from the school to the parents must go through the office or Principal and vice versa.
- 7. Private tuitions are strongly discouraged. In case a student genuinely needs additional guidance, please consult the matter with the Principal.
- 8. Expensive gifts, cakes etc to the staff and students are highly discouraged for birthday celebrations. If interested, parents may contribute books to the school library or sponsor prizes for various competitions.
- 9. Parents shall not meet any teacher or student without the prior permission from Principal/Manager. There is not meet up with teachers and students during class hours.

- 10. The school handbook should be brought school everyday. Parents should go through daily and sign the remarks, any.
- 11. Parents are to go through the results examinations check the progress of the children. Parents have refrain from kinds of unhealthy competitions among them behalf students scores.
- 12. Parents are specially requested to inform the school any change in address and contact number.
- 13. The school will not be responsible for the loss, damage robbery of a pupil's belongings. It is not advisable for pupils to bring money or valuable articles unnecessary to school.
- 14. Parents are informed that their children are liable to disciplinary measures or penalty or be sent home by the school authorities for any of the following reasons:
 - (i) Not wearing the correct uniform and identity card.
 - (ii) Not having the report-card signed when required.
 - (iii) Not having the signature of parents or guardian a remark, made by the Principal/ Class Teacher / Teacher-in-charge the handbook.
 - (iv) Not being on time for assembly or class.
 - (v) Repeatedly forgetting to bring books and home works.
 - (vi) Deliberate absence for important days
- 15. Parents are expected to go familiar with rules and regulations of this school given in this handbook and from time to time through circulars.
- 16. Parents are reminded to prescribe from admitting restraining child in The decision of the Principal final and indisputable

- regarding evaluation of answer papers, allotment of marks, promotion etc.
- 17. A parent's misbehaviour speech and deeds can result the child's dismissal from the School.
- 18. Criticism of your child's teachers in their presence is to be strictly avoided. Such behaviour from your side brings disrespect and lack of esteem for the teachers.
- 19. All parents are to compulsorily participate in school PTM meeting for the welfare of school and children.
- 19. Parents are encouraged to communicate to the school authorities their feedbacks, suggestions and complaints through E-mails, phone or through the suggestion box provided at the school office.
- 20. The school will not entertain any anonymous calls, complaints or requests.

F. LIBRARY RULES

- 1. Library will be open from 9.30 a.m to 3.30 p.m on all working days.
- 2. Pupils of class V to X will have access to books, periodicals, magazines and newspapers in the library. Pupils of class I to IV will follow the class library system.
- 3. Perfect silence and order must be maintained in the library.
- 4. No one may take any book from the library without having it entered in the register/computer.
- 5. Students of class V to X may borrow one book at a time on their library Register in. Library books are not transferable.

- Books are issued for one week at a time. They must be returned on the due date. Books for which there is immediate demand will not be issued. A fine per week will be charged for due book.
- 7. Students are responsible for books borrowed on their register. Any damage to books should be pointed out at the time of borrowing and the signature of the librarian to be obtained. Loss of books or damages to them discovered at the time of return will have to be compensated by the student.
- 8. Before the book is returned to the library the necessary entry must be made in the school handbook, on the page reserved for the same.
- 9. If a book is lost it will have to be replaced with a new one or double the amount of the market price of the same will have to be paid.
- 10. Those who fail to abide by the rules will be deprived of the privilege of using books from the library.
- 11. All books must be returned before April and October holidays.
- 12. It is strictly forbidden to write any remark in the books or underline the words. If there are such marks already found in the book they should be shown to the librarian on receipt of the book.

G. CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

 For the overall development of a young student, school takes keen interest in conducting various co-curricular activities.
 Parents are therefore requested to encourage, help and co-

- operate to see that their wards participate in the activities conducted by the school.
- 2. Participating in co-curricular activities help the students in qualities of sharing, caring, brotherhood, teamwork, service, leadership and openness to corrections apart from other physical aspects.
- 3. The school conduct study tours every year for its students. The purpose of such trips are to get exposure to real life situations, have a refreshment of minds, imbibe values such as co-operation, adaptability, responsibility, leadership, sharing etc. However, the trips are not compulsory and the risks are shared by the students, parents and the school.

THE CONSTITUTION OF INDIA

(PREAMBLE)

WE, THE PEOPLE OF INDIA, having solemnly resolved to constitute India into a SOVEREIGN SOCIALIST SECULAR DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC and to secure to all its citizens:

JUSTICE, social, economic and political; **LIBERTY** of thought, expression, belief, faith and worship;

EQUALITY of status and of opportunity; and to promote among them all **FRATERNITY** assuring the dignity of the individual and the unity and integrity of the Nation;

IN OUR CONSTITUENT ASSEMBLY this twenty-sixth day of November, 1949, do HEREBYADOPT, ENACTAND GIVE TO OURSELVES THIS CONSTITUTION

Article 51 A (FUNDAMENTAL DUTIES)

It shall be the duty of every citizen of India

- a. to abide by the Constitution and respect its ideals and institution, the National Flag and the National Anthem;
- to cherish and follow the noble ideals which inspired our national struggle for freedom;
- c. to uphold and protect the sovereignty, unity and integrity of India:
- d. to defend the country and render national service when called upon to do so;
- e. to promote harmony and the spirit of common brotherhood amongst all the people of India transcending religious, linguistic and regional or sectional diversities; to renounce practices derogatory to the dignity of women;
- f. to value and preserve the rich heritage of our composite culture; g. to protect and improve the natural environment including forests, lakes, rivers and wild life, and to have compassion for living creatures;
- h. to develop the scientific temper, humanism and the spirit of inquiry and reform;
- i. to safeguard public property and to abjure violence;
- to strive towards excellence in all spheres of individual and collective activity so that the Nation constantly rises to higher levels of endeavour and achievement.

NATIONAL SYMBOLS

NATIONAL FLAG

Our National Flag is a horizontal tricolour of deep saffron (Kesari) at the top, white in the middle and dark green at the bottom in equal proportion. Ratio of the width of the flag to its length is 2:3.

In the centre of the white band is a navy blue wheel which represents the Dharma Chakra (Wheel of law). Its design is that of the wheel which appears on the abacus of the Sarnath Lion Capital of Ashoka. Its diameter approximates to the width of the white and it has 24 spokes. The top band of Saffron colour indicates the strength and courage of the country. The strip between the white is a symbol of peace and truth with Dharma Chakra. The lower green exhibits fertility, growth and auspiciousness of the land. Design of the National flag was adopted by the constituent assembly of India on 22 July 1947. Its use and display are regulated by a code.

NATIONAL EMBLEM

The emblem of India is an adaptation of the Lion Capital of Ashoka at Sarnath. The actual Sarnath capital including four Asiatic lions standing back to back-symbolizing power, courage, pride and confidence is mounted on a circular base.

At the bottom, it has one horse and a bull. At its centre it has a beautiful wheel (Dharma Chakra). The abacus is girded with a frieze of sculptures in high relief of an elephant (of the east), a bull (of the west), a horse (of the south) and a (lion of the north), separated by intervening wheels, over a lotus in full bloom, exemplifying the fountainhead of life and creative inspiration. Carved out of a single block of polished sandstone, the capital is crowned by the Wheel of the Law (Dharma Chakra). Forming an integral part of the emblem is the motto inscribed below the abacus in Devanagiri script: Satyameva Jayate (Truth Alone Triumphs). This is a quote from Mundaka Upanishad, the concluding part of the sacred Hindu Vedas. This National Emblem was adopted on 26 January 1950, the day that India became a Republic.

NATIONAL ANTHEM

The Song Jana-Gana-Mana, written in highly Sanskritized Bengali by nobel Laurete Rabindranath Tagore, was adopted by the Constituent Assembly as the National Anthem of India on 24 January 1950. It was first sung on 27 December 1911 at the Culcutta session of the Indian National Congress. A formal rendition of the Anthem takes 52 seconds.
